PARISH RENEWAL PRAYER GROUPS: We are stepping into autumn. It is a time when nature goes to a sleep, in order to wake up bright, vibrant and loud in spring. We too need to think about focussing on ourselves spiritually after the summer holidays, visits, parties. Like nature we need to begin to store up spiritual energy for our day today living. There is a desire in the parish for prayer groups to focus on the same. I understand your work, pressure etc. This is an invitation for each of you and all of you, to consider forming a Prayer Group or being part of one. You may choose the time to meet at your convenience, at any home of the group members. If you think of spending time with the Blessed Sacrament, that privilege will be encouraged too. Kindly give it a thought. St. Paul urges us, "... For you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So, then, let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober... since we belong to the day, let us be sober and put on the breastplate of faith and love and for a helmet the hope of salvation." 1 Thes. 5:5-8

POPE FRANCIS: WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION & II PART OF "LAUDATO SI": "We must never forget that the younger generations have the right to receive a beautiful and liveable world from us, and that this implies that we have a grave responsibility towards creation which we have received from the generous hands of God," said the Pope. His message calls on us to 'Listen to the voice of creation' the sweet song in praise of our creator alongside the plea lamenting our mistreatment of our common home. He revealed that the second part of his encyclical Laudato si' will be published on 4 October, on the Feast of St. Francis... "...Let us join our Christian brothers and sisters in the commitment to care for creation as a sacred gift from the Creator."

EVANGELII GAUDIUM SUNDAY: "Evangelii Gaudium" is Latin for "Joy of the Gospel", which calls us to be joyous in proclaiming our faith. We cannot forget that evangelisation is first and foremost about preaching the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus Christ or who have always rejected him. Many of these are quietly seeking God, led by a yearning to see his face... Christians have the duty to proclaim the Gospel without excluding anyone. Evangelii Gaudium, §14.

POPE FRANCIS: 60TH ANNIVERSARY OF PACEM IN TERRIS: Pope Francis sent a message to participants in an International Conference to commemorate the sixtieth anniversary of the Pacem in Terris, the landmark encyclical of Pope St. John XXIII. He renewed his calls for nations to eliminate nuclear weapons and use 'conventional' arms only in self-defence. He emphasised, that the conference is taking place "as our world continues to be in the grip of a third world war... in the tragic case of the conflict in Ukraine, not without the threat of recourse to nuclear weapons." He urged participants to analyse current military and technology-based threats to peace, as well as disciplined ethical reflection "on the grave risks associated with the continuing possession of nuclear weapons, the urgent need for renewed progress in disarmament, and the development of peace-building initiatives..." and repeated his statement, "The use of atomic energy for purposes of war is immoral, just as the possessing of nuclear weapons is immoral... "a world free of nuclear arms is possible and necessary." (The Hiroshima Peace Memorial in 2019)
