POPE FRANCIS: WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION & II PART OF "LAUDATO SI": "We must never forget that the younger generations have the right to receive a beautiful and liveable world from us, and that this implies that we have a grave responsibility towards creation which we have received from the generous hands of God," said the Pope. The 2nd part of his encyclical Laudato si' will be published on 4 October, on the Feast of St. Francis... <u>"It is "necessary to stand with</u> the victims of environmental and climate injustice, striving to end the senseless war on our common home which is a terrible world war.... to play a part to "transform our hearts, our lifestyles, and the public policies ruling our societies..."

POPE FRANCIS: MEDITERRANEAN MEETING: "Mediterranean is 'beginning and foundation of peace...' We must not forget that what the Romans used to call mare nostrum (our sea) has been for millennia "a place of encounter: among the Abrahamic religions; among Greek, Latin and Arabic thought; among science, philosophy and law; and among many other realities..." Echoing the words of the now Venerable late mayor of Florence, Giorgio La Pira, who inspired the Mediterranean Meetings initiative, Pope said, "Amidst today's sea of conflicts, we are here to enhance the contribution of the Mediterranean, so that it can return to being a laboratory of peace. For this is its vocation, to be a place where different countries and realities can encounter each other on the basis of the humanity we all share, and not on the basis of contrasting ideologies."
