LOUDfence WALES: STANDING WITH VICTIMS & SURVIVORS OF ABUSE: The Catholic community in Wales has spent a week standing in prayerful solidarity with victims and survivors of abuse at the country's first LOUDsence event, which took place in Cardiff from 21-28 October 2023. It is a survivor-led initiative, open to everyone, that gives a voice to those who have experienced abuse within a faith-based setting or have been affected by it. At its Mass on October 21, Archbishop Mark O'Toole, offered a sincere apology and called for reparation - not just though words but, more importantly, through actions: "We know of the betrayal of the innocent who have suffered at the hands of those from whom they should have experienced only life and love. If you have suffered in any way like this, within the life of the Church, I offer my profoundest apology... We need reparation for all those times that representatives of the Church we love, the Church founded by Christ, have: taken advantage of the young and the vulnerable by committing acts of abuse; or turned a blind eye to the suffering of those who were abused and their families; or failed to prevent abusers from continuing to offend; or stood silent in the face of abuse... We stand in solidarity with you. We ask for the grace to be able to stand close, to hear your stories, and continue to allow them to be heard."

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: The face of a synodal Church Synodality is a first step. It is a term that the participants in the Synod themselves admit is "a term unfamiliar to many members of the People of God, causing some people confusion and concern" (1 f), including fears of a departure from tradition, a debasement of the hierarchical nature of the Church (1 g), a loss of power or, on the contrary, immobility and a lack of courage for change. "Synodal" and "synodality" are instead terms that "speak of a mode of being Church that integrates communion, mission, and participation". So they indicate a way of living the Church, valuing differences and developing the active involvement of all. This begins with deacons, priests, and bishops: "A synodal Church cannot do without their voices" (1 n), we read. "We need an understanding of the reasons for resistance to synodality by some of them".

PARISH RENEWAL PRAYER GROUPS: 1 THES. 5:5-8: We are stepping into autumn. It is a time when nature goes into a sleep, in order to wake up bright, vibrant and loud in spring. Like nature we need to begin to store up spiritual energy for our day today living. There is a desire in the parish for prayer groups to focus on the same. I understand your work, pressure etc. This is an invitation for each of you and all of you, to consider forming a Prayer Group or being part of one. You may choose the time to meet at your convenience, in the home of any of the group members. If you think of spending time with the Blessed Sacrament, that privilege will be encouraged too. I am convinced that you will give it a serious thought.
