This latter fund, of course, is particularly pertinent at the moment, given the situation in Israel and Gaza.

BISHOP MARK O'TOOLE'S PASTORAL LETTER & FEEDBACK: I am certain that all of you either read or listened, and reflected on the Pastoral Letter from our Bishop Mark O'Toole. The feedback for the same is very important. After the busy time of welcoming Jesus into our hearts and homes, we will have more time to further reflect on the same. In the early 2024, we will have opportunities to share our thoughts and discuss them with Bishop Mark. First of all, there will a meeting with Bishop Mark and two representatives each from each parish both of Menevia and Cardiff. For Menevia it will be on 3rd Feb (Sat) at 10:00am, St Mary's, Carmarthen. The clergy will have the similar meeting at the extra-ordinary Deanery meetings, called by Bishop Mark. Then there will be various meetings with a few parishes together in different parts of both dioceses. We are privileged to host one of those for our area.

The Open Listening Meeting & Station Mass will be here on February 20th at 5pm., followed by Lenten Station Mass. So, kindly note the date in advance to avoid having to give an apology.

<u>CHRISTMAS REMEMBRANCE TREE:</u> Tree tags and cards will be on sale in the porches. They are still only £1 each. The sale of these tags will support church-based charities. Write the name of your chosen person on the tag and hang it on the tree. You can send the card to that person or to their family if the person is deceased.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION & CATECHISTS: We will begin our preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation in the new year. The celebration will be in June, 2024. A reshuffle of Catechists will take place, to also absorb new volunteers for this great service. Parents of the children from non-Catholic Schools, who would like to prepare for First Holy Communion, kindly talk to Fr. Paul after one of the Holy Masses.

PRAY FOR PEACE THIS CHRISTMAS: WALES' CHRISTIAN LEADERS: Christian leaders representing Wales, have joined together to invite people to pray for peace this Christmas. The Catholic Archbishop of Cardiff and Bishop of Menevia, Mark O'Toole, the Anglican Archbishop of Wales, Andrew John, and the Moderator of the Free Church Council of Wales, Simon Walkling, have issued a joint message acknowledging the tensions and tragedies in the world today, whilst encouraging people to "come to church to find space" to reflect and make time to pray for peace this Christmas." The news has been full of the terrible tragedy unfolding in Gaza after the awful terrorist attack on Israel. Thousands of children killed in a war they did not choose. It seems a long way from the Christmas adverts here and the pressure to be merry. It is understandable that the church leaders in Jerusalem have invited Christians there to forego any unnecessarily festive activities and stand strong with those facing affliction. They see it as standing in support of those continuing to suffer, just as Jesus did by being born as a baby in Bethlehem two thousand years ago. Jesus was born in a land occupied by the Romans. He was born away from home because of an imperial census. There were family tensions around Mary being pregnant and Jesus was laid in a feeding trough because there was no room at the inn. Herod killed the boys in Bethlehem to get rid of the threat to his power. All these are part of Christmas, along with our joy at God's love and the traditions which help us celebrate. This Christmas, we may be aware of tensions in families, and the difficulties of making ends meet. This year we remember the wars in the land of Jesus' birth, Ukraine and other parts of the world. We also remember that this year was the centenary of the Wales Women's Peace Appeal which took a petition to America about joining the League of Nations to promote 'Law not War'. It was a message signed by around 60% of women in Wales and went from home to home and hearth to hearth, showing what the co-ordinated work of ordinary people could achieve. We need peace in our world. We may want to be free of tension in our families. We may long for five minutes of peace for ourselves in all the Christmas preparations. Why not come to church to find space to reflect and make time to pray for peace this Christmas? We are praying for joy and hope for us all.
