We, as a parish, are privileged to host one of the area meetings with a few parishes together. <u>The Open Listening Meeting & Station Mass will be here on February 20th</u> at 5pm with Adoration. <u>Teas & coffees with sandwiches & snacks will be after the Holy Mass.</u>

HOLY SEASON OF LENT- LENT IS A TIME OF CONVERSION & FREEDOM, A FLASH OF NEW HOPE:



"When our God reveals Himself, His message is always one of freedom," Pope Francis says in the opening of his Message to the faithful for Lent 2024. Recalling the Exodus of the Hebrew people from Egypt, the Holy Father explains that our journey through the desert can be a season of grace – not an abstract journey, but a concrete path that involves seeing the world as it is and hearing the cries of our oppressed brothers and sisters. He insisted on the need to counter a "globalisation of indifference." He advised, "Our Lenten journey will be concrete if we realize that

even today we remain under the rule of Pharoah. A rule that makes us weary and indifferent. A model of growth that divides us and robs us of our future." At the same time, Pope Francis reminded us that it is God who takes the initiative. Too often, he said, there remains within us "an inexplicable longing for slavery," a desire to cling to idols that paralyse us, as Israel was paralysed in the desert. Lent, however, is a "season of grace, a time of conversion," where the



desert can become "a place where our freedom can mature in a personal decision not to fall back into slavery," where "we find new criteria of justice and a community with which we can press forward on a road not yet taken." … Lenten journey involves a struggle. It is a time for action, the Pope said, but also a time "to pause" – to pause in prayer and to pause "in the presence of a wounded brother or sister… Love of God and love of neighbour are one love, the contemplative dimension" of Lent can help us "release new energies," to be "more sensitive to one another: in the place of threats and enemies, we discover companions and fellow travellers." Lent is a flash of new hope… to the extent that this Lent becomes a time of conversion, an anxious humanity will notice a burst of creativity, a flash of new hope. Calling on the faithful to "be ready to take risks," he invited them "to find the courage to see our world, not as in its death throes, but in a process of giving birth; not at the end, but at the beginning of a great new chapter of history… Faith and charity take hope, this small child, by the hand. They teach her to walk, and at the same time, she leads them forward."

POPE FRANCIS: ASH WEDNESDAY MESSAGE: Pope Francis urged Catholics to carve out a silent space for God amid the buzz of the digital era in which little remains private as he opened the Lenten season with a procession and Mass on Ash Wednesday. In his homily, the Pope focused on the emphasis that the day's scripture readings place on praying, fasting and giving alms "in secret", saying that Jesus's invitation to the disciples to "go to your room" to do these things instead of seeking public recognition for them is at the heart of the Lenten season. Going to one's room, he said, "means journeying from without to within, so that our whole life, including our relationship with God, is not reduced to mere outward show, a frame without a picture, a draping of the soul, but is born from within and reflects the movements of our heart... Without realizing it, we find ourselves no longer having an 'inner chamber' in which we can stop and care for ourselves, immersed as we are in a world in which everything, including our emotions and deepest feelings, has to become 'social'," he said. "In the social media era, "even the most tragic and painful experiences risk not having a quiet place where they can be kept. Everything has to be exposed, shown off, fed to the gossip-mill of the moment... However, God's invitation for Lent is to "enter into the secret, return to the centre of yourself... Precisely there, where so many fears, feelings of guilt and sin are lurking, precisely there the Lord has descended in order to heal and cleanse you."

LENTEN BOWL: The Liturgy of the Eucharist on Maundy Thursday begins with the Procession of the Gifts. The Missal instructs that the collection of gifts and money today be for the poor (14). <u>It is appropriate to include gifts collected during Lent as the fruits of penance.</u> During this procession the Ubi Caritas (Where charity and love is...) is sung. <u>Therefore, remember to place the "Lenten Bowl" on your dining table where the gifts & money for the poor can be collected.</u>

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION: FIRST HOLY COMMUNION: We will shortly begin the preparation for the First Holy Communion, for children from Non-Catholic Schools. Parents of the children from non-Catholic Schools, kindly talk to Fr. Paul after one of the Holy Masses.
