BISHOP MARK O'TOOLE'S PASTORAL LETTER & FEEDBACK: The feedback for the Pastoral Letter from our Bishop Mark O'Toole is very important. In February 2024, we will have opportunities to share our thoughts and discuss them with Bishop Mark. First of all, there will a meeting with Bishop Mark and two representatives each from each parish both of Menevia and Cardiff. <u>For Menevia it will be on 3rd Feb (Sat)</u> at 10:00am, St Mary's, Carmarthen. I am grateful on behalf of all to Pat Mansfield & Ann Harris who have represented our Parish at the meeting. The clergy will have the similar meeting at the extra-ordinary Deanery meetings, called by Bishop Mark. Then there will be various meetings with a few parishes together in different parts of both dioceses. We are privileged to host one of those for our area on Feb. 20th.

FLAME 2025: Booking opens for Flame 2025. Flame is the largest Catholic youth gathering in the UK, and we can't wait for it's return in March 2025! Most recently, in March of last year, Flame 2023 welcomed over 8,000 young people to the OVO Arena, Wembley for a day of inspirational speakers, world-class Christian musicians and moments of prayer and Adoration. from young people and group leaders have highlighted the transformative experience that Flame has provided young people. In his welcome address, Fr Dominic Howarth, chair of the Flame organising group, reminded young people that this is <u>"Church as you've never been it before. But have no doubt, this is Church."</u> Group booking opened on 31st January 2024 – the Feast of St John Bosco, patron for youth.

POPE TO YOUNG PEOPLE: BE RESTLESS, TAKE RISKS: Pope urges young people to Stay restless, take risks, and never lose your sense of wonder. Pope Francis began his address by warning against "what some call 'short thought' (pensiero breve)". 'Short thought', he said, is "made up of a few characters, and burns quickly; a thought that does not look upwards and ahead, but at the here and now ... a thought that does not look back at history... Faced with the complexity of life and the world, this short thought leads to generalisation and criticism, to simplification and the distortion of reality, in the pursuit of one's own immediate interests instead of the good of others and the future of all." "Do you dream?," Pope Francis asked the young people. "Do you have restlessness in your thoughts, in your hearts? Are you restless or are you 'retired' young people already? Do not forget: restless dreaming. And not be afraid to risk". "Please risk, risk" the Pope urged. "If you do not risk, who will?"

MARRIAGE WEEK 2024: Marriage Week is an annual celebration offering the opportunity to support and promote marriage and family life. It is celebrated this year from 7-14 February. A Christian marriage is rooted in faith; that means faith in God, as the giver of life and the one who promises eternal life to those who believe in him.

JUBILEE YEAR: The Holy Father has asked that 2024 be a 'Year of Prayer'. This Pilgrims of prayer booklet, produced by the Institute of Jesuits, introduces exercises that you may find useful to practise prayer. Introduction to Pilgrims of Prayer... There are many exercises for improving our physical health and wellbeing. Ignatius of Loyola wrote what he called the Spiritual Exercises, a variety of ways of praying to develop our spiritual health and wellbeing, our relationship with God and the world. Just like physical exercise, if we talk about it but don't actually engage in any exercise, this will not be very fruitful! So, with this booklet we introduce exercises that you may find it useful to practise – and the more you practise, the more benefits you will feel. This booklet introduces a number of these prayer exercises and guides you through them.
