"God, whom we often imagine to be beyond problems, came to live in our life and its problems. This is how he came to us. He did not come as a fully grown adult, but very little. He lived in a family, as the son of a mother and father. He spent most of his time there, growing, learning, in a life made up of ordinariness, hiddenness and silence. And he did not avoid difficulties. Rather, by choosing a family, a family that was "expert in suffering", he says this to our families: "If you are



facing difficulties, I know what you are experiencing. I experienced it. I, my mother and my father, we experienced it so we could say to your family too: You are not alone!"" POPE FRANCIS

MAUNDY THURSDAY: Maundy Thursday or Holy Thursday is the day during Holy Week that commemorates the Washing of the Feet (Maundy) and Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles, as described in the canonical gospels. On this Our Lord Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist & the Sacred Priesthood, sharing the Lord's Priesthood. "Maundy" comes from the Latin word mandatum, or commandment, reflecting Jesus' words "I give you a new commandment." "Mandatum novum do vobis ut diligatis invicem sicut dilexi vos" which means "A new commandment I give unto you: That you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another." With the importance of the First Holy Mass, we celebrate the washing of the feet symbolising service, accompanying the bread and wine will be our Lenten offertory, i.e., whatever we collected as individuals or as a family, through our sacrifice (whatever we gave up for Lent) which will be donated to the benefit of the poor and needy. Another highlight of the celebration is our accompanying our Lord Jesus, by watching & praying with him.





GOOD FRIDAY: Good Friday is derived from the accounts of the Gospels and the early Christian commemorations of the crucifixion. It is a Christian holy day commemorating the crucifixion of Jesus and his death at Calvary. It is observed during Holy Week as part of the Paschal Triduum. The highlights of the celebration are the Stations of the Cross, the Good Friday service which is unique and different from Holy Mass, the Passion narrative, the Solemn Intercessions, the Veneration of the Cross, the Communion from the reserved sacrament. It is attending the Liturgy, meditating on the Passion, kissing the cross, fasting and abstaining from meat, performing acts of charity and penance. We remember our Lord Jesus who suffered, died and was buried. We also remember the Sorrowful Mother who accompanied Jesus to Calvary and witnessed to his suffering, agony and the last breath, after which he was laid in her lap, before his burial. On this day, we remember as a universal church, the Holy Land, and support it financially.

EASTER VIGIL: The Easter Vigil is the high point of the Easter Triduum celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus. It is the "Mother of All Vigils" and Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays. The season of Easter is the most important of all liturgical times, which Catholics celebrate as the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the Resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. The Easter Vigil is the longest service of the year, and it is when catechumens receive the Catholic Sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion on the same night. Baptised members of different denominations enter into Full Communion with the Catholic Church on this night.

You are invited to the Charismatic Retreat on Saturday 20th April 10 am - 3.15 pm at St David's & St Patrick's, Haverfordwest (SA61 1SX). The day begins with Mass.

LENTEN BOWL: The Liturgy of the Eucharist on Maundy Thursday begins with the Procession of the Gifts. The Missal instructs that the collection of gifts and money today be for the poor (14). It is appropriate to include gifts collected during Lent as the fruits of penance. During this procession the Ubi Caritas (Where charity and love is...) is sung. Therefore, remember to place the "Lenten Bowl" on your dining table where the gifts & money for the poor can be collected.
