COME & SEE WEEKENDS 2024 - WHITLAND ABBEY: The Whitland Community of Cistercian Nuns are inviting Catholic women aged between 25 - 45, to discern their religious vocation and to experience a monastic life. The dates are: May 24th – 27th & August 16th – 19th weekends.

WORLD CHILDREN'S DAY 2024: The Catholic Church's first World Children's Day takes place over the weekend of May 25th - 26th, 2024. Pope Francis announced the inauguration of this special day on 8 December 2023 at the end of the Angelus. The concept came from a nine-year-old boy, Alessandro, who, just a few months earlier had written to Pope Francis with an idea to bring children together from different countries for a special event. Alessandro's hope was that the children could get to know one another, play and pray together, and become friends.

VOCATION SUNDAY - APRIL 21, 2024: Archbishop Malcolm McMahon, the Chair of the National Office for Vocation, affirms the value of being a good listener in order to hear God's call to holiness. "One of our modern problems is that our world is very noisy, and it is often difficult to hear our own voices and thoughts in the surrounding din, let alone the words of others," he writes. "One situation that can occur is we find ourselves on set paths in life, and it is not easy to change direction even if we want to do just that. Commitment to our families and other responsibilities block our ears and we just carry on as before." Archbishop McMahon is keen to highlight the huge value of priests, nuns and monks to the Church: "There is no doubt that the church needs priests to celebrate the Eucharist and other sacraments, and Religious to offer a living witness to the values of the Kingdom of God. Without them, we would be a very impoverished Church." He suggests women and men should ask whether their vocational journey is likely to bring them contentment: "One simple test is whether following a particular path in life gives us joy. If we are happy and content, or at least think we will be, then it is worth giving it a try. I am not saying that we should be deliriously happy all the time but he proposes two pillars of Catholic life that can help people interpret God's call - serving others and spending time before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. "Adoration is a special kind of prayer which helps us shirk off everything except that one person who is important to us - Jesus Christ. Pope Francis' second point was to steer us towards service of others. In serving others, giving ourselves to other people in response to different needs, we undoubtedly find Jesus."

VOCATION - MAKING GOD'S DREAM COME TRUE: Pope Francis said that when we speak of "vocation," then, it is not just about choosing this or that way of life, or devoting one's life to a certain ministry, or being attracted by the charism of a religious family, movement, or ecclesial community. It is about making God's dream come true, the great vision of fraternity that Jesus cherished when He prayed to the Father 'that they may all be one'. We are in God's heart... As Christians, we do not only receive a vocation individually; we are also called together. We are like the tiles of a mosaic," he said. "Each is lovely <u>in itself, but only when they are put together do they form a picture. Each of us shines like a star in</u> the heart of God and in the firmament of the universe."
